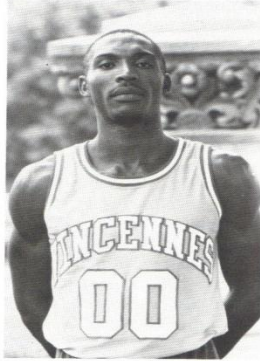

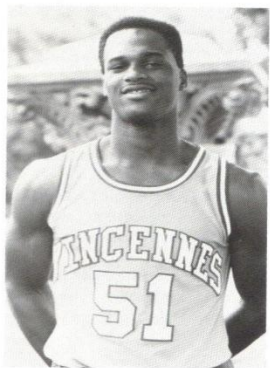
51 - MIKE BOYKIN

At VU he is a General Studies major.



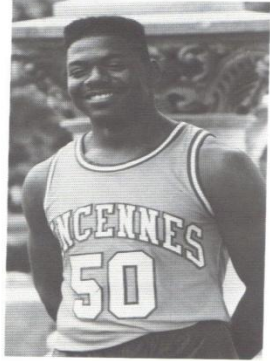

At VU he is a General Studies major.

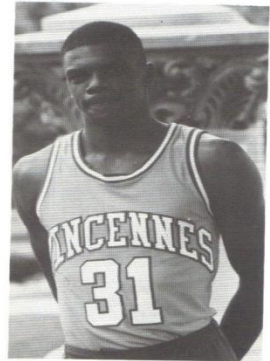


31 - DWAYNE CRITTENDON

At VU he is a Broadcasting major.

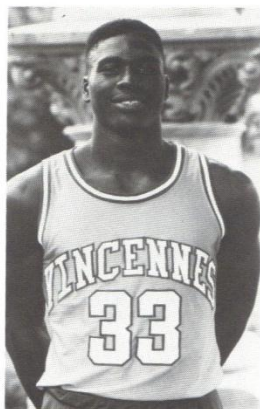


33 - JASON EDWARDS

At VU he is an Accounting major.

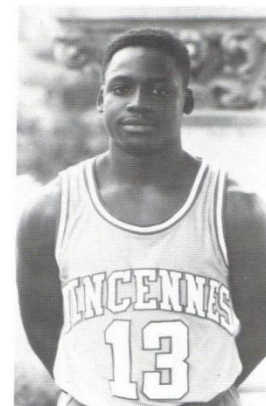


13 - LEON JOHNSON

At VU he is an Accounting major.



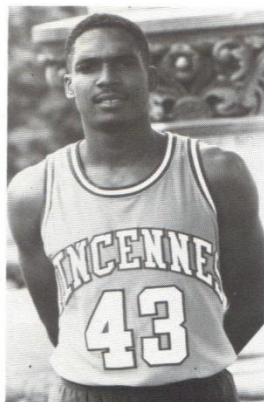
43 - WILLIE HOLLIDAY

At VU he is a Computer Engineering major.

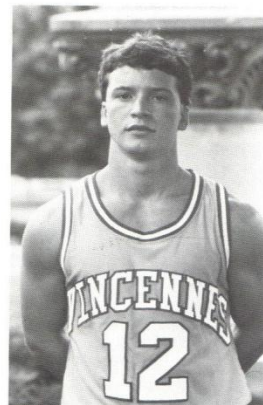


12 - RUSTY JOHNSON

Vincennes, Indiana

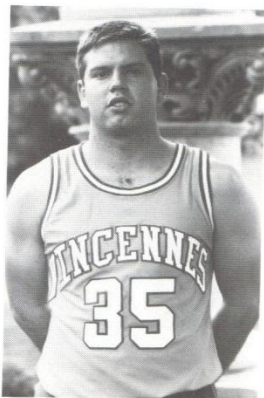

He is an exceptional baseball pitcher and earned a 7-2 record for Rantoul High School.

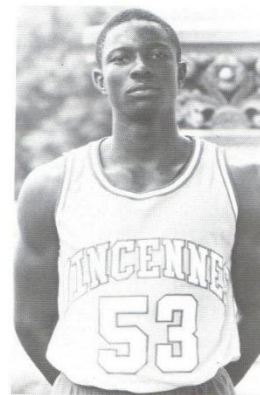

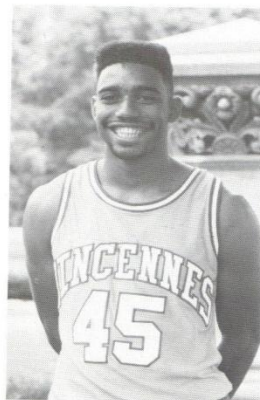
Last season James started 19 games for the Trailblazers including starting assignments throughout NJCAA tourney play. He scored a high game of 22 points against Kaskaskia.

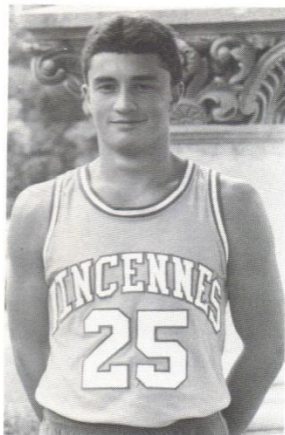


45 - TOMMY SMITH

Troy was named to the All-Blue Chip Conference team and was the recipient of the Jaycee Rebounding Award.

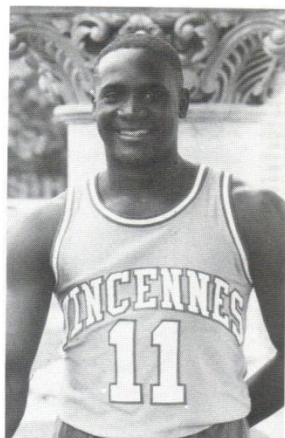

At VU he is a Business Management major.

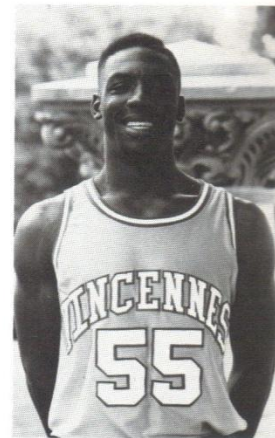


55 - ANTON WALTON

At VU he is a Pre-Law major.

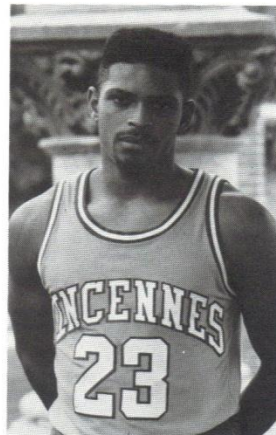


23 - STEVE WORTHY

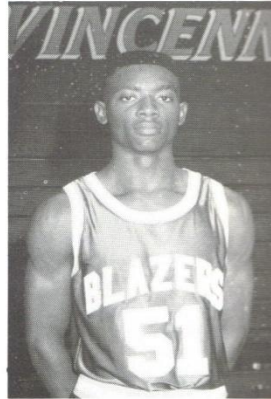

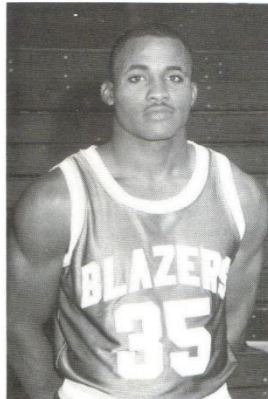
Acha is a graduate of Benue High School and played club sport basketball last season averaging 25 points and 7.1 rebounds per contest.

At Vincennes University he is a Physical Education major.

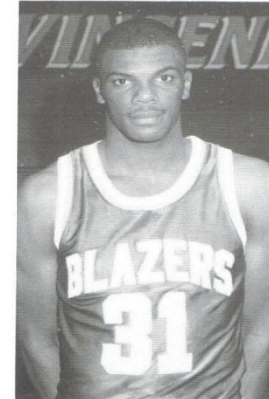

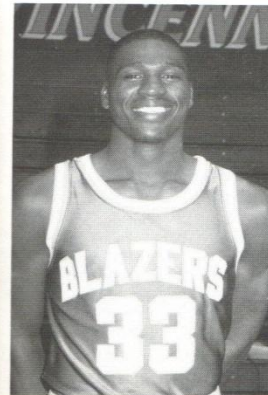

At VU he is an Accounting major.

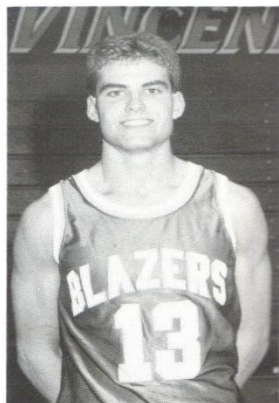

At Vincennes University he is a General Studies major.

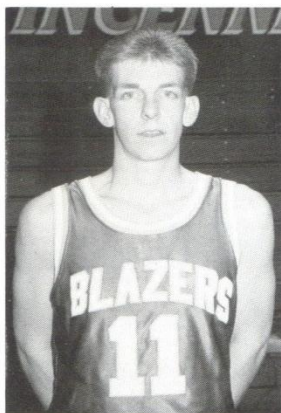

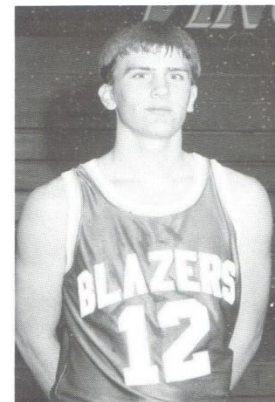

He was a catcher on the Dugger Union baseball team.

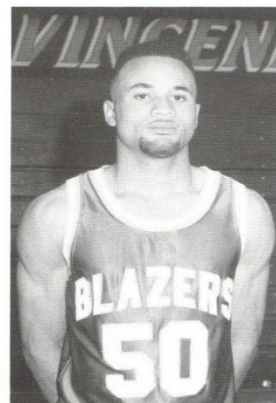
