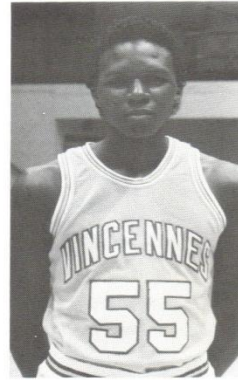

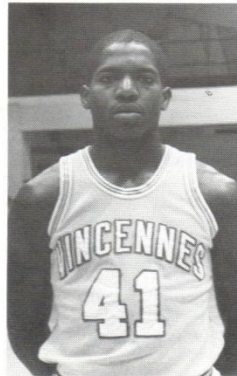

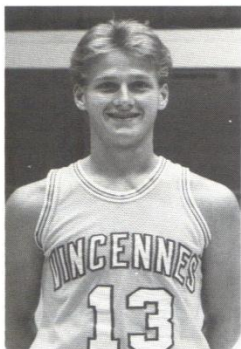

Besides his basketball abilities Jeff was a tight end on the Lawrenceville football team.

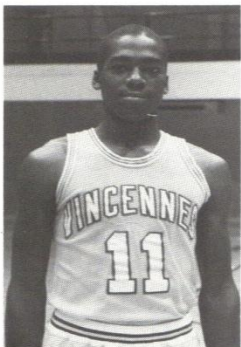

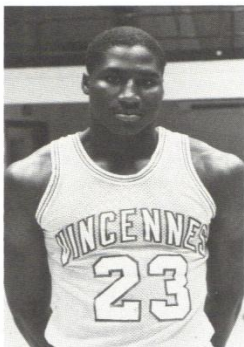
JEFF HUFFMON

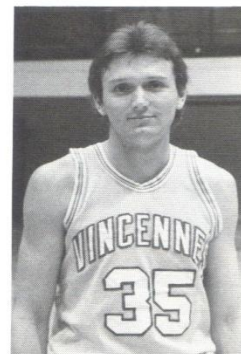

At Vincennes University, he is a General Studies major.

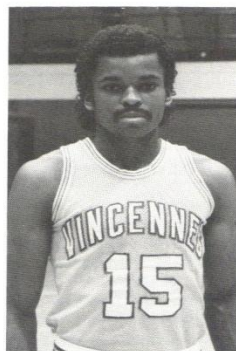

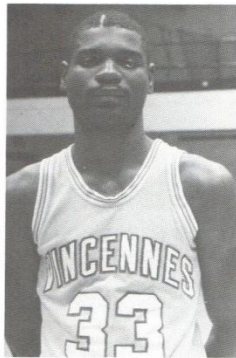


DOLAS McCANN

 New Orleans, Louisiana

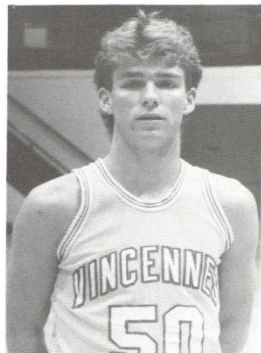

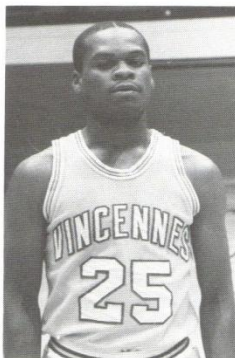

At Vincennes University, he is a Computer Science major.

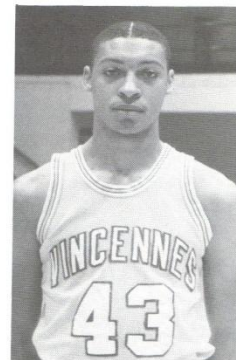

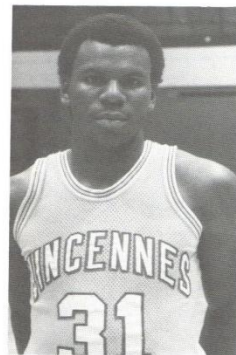

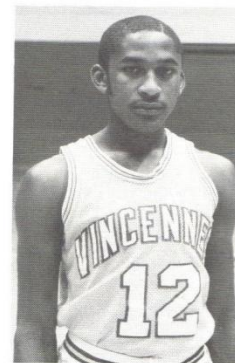

At Vincennes University, he is a Physical Education major.

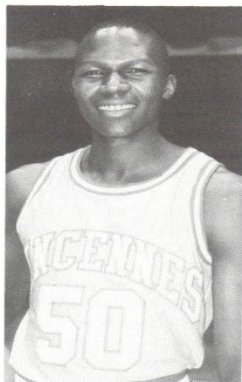

At Vincennes University, he is a Social Work major.

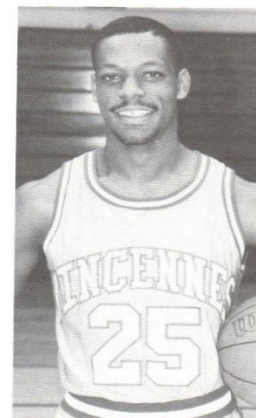

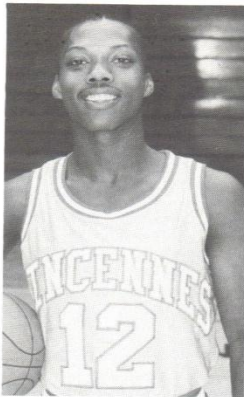
MARK LENOIR

At Vincennes he is a Physical Education major.





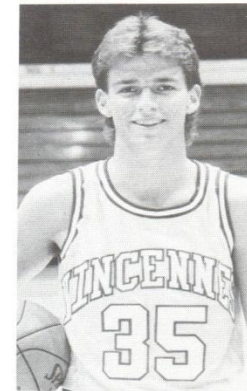

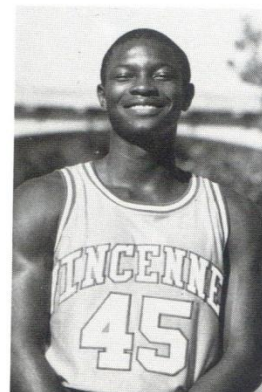
At Rivet he received his team's rebound and free throw awards last season and earned a spot on the All-Vincennes Sectional and the Blue Chip Conference All-Star teams.

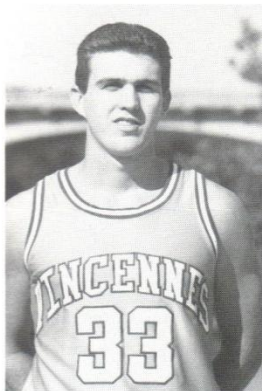


45 - JAMES ODEH

Woodlawn, Illinois

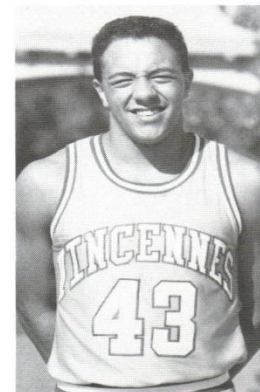

At VU he is a Physical Education major.



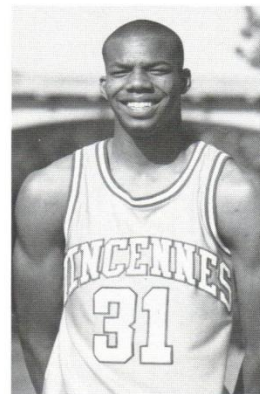
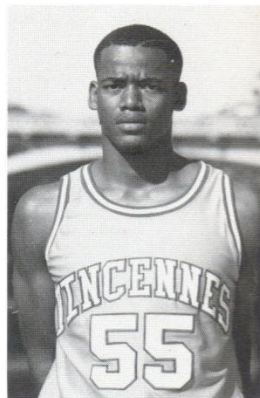
55 - DARYL REED

At Vincennes University he is a Physical Education major.



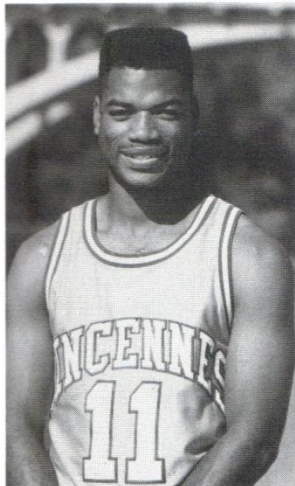
