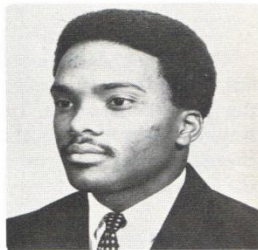

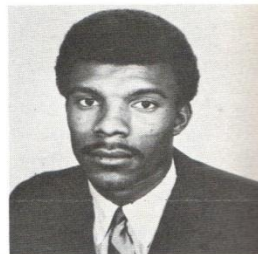
JOSE DeCAUSEY

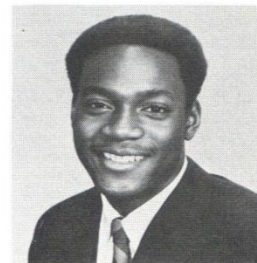

Guard-6'4" - - Senior-Indianapolis, Ind.

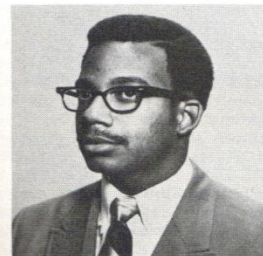

Forward-6'3" - - Senior-Indianapolis, Ind.

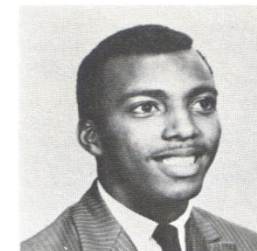

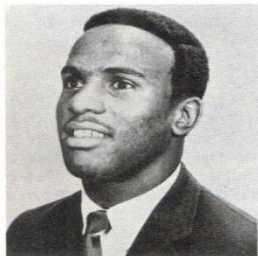
ROBERT McADOO

North Carolina record with a leap of 6'8½". At Vincennes University he will study for a business career.

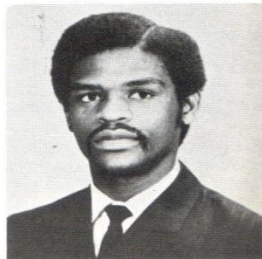
WILBUR POPE

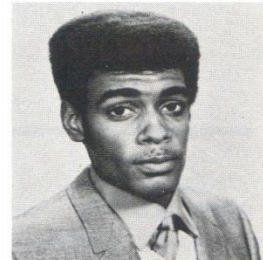
CRAIG ROSS

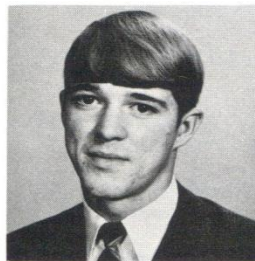


ROY SIMPSON

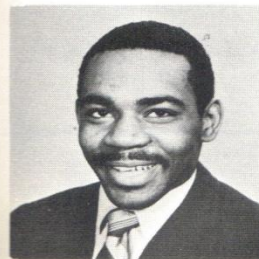
TOBY MALICHI

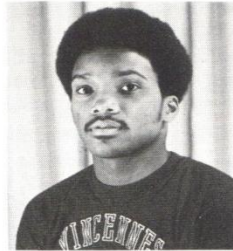

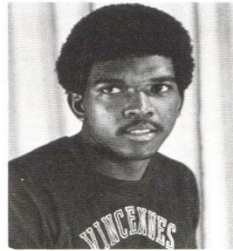

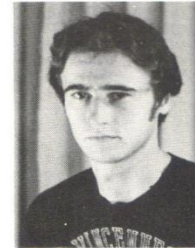

Forward-6'10" -- Senior-Cincinnati, Ohio

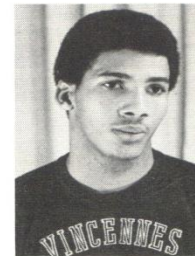

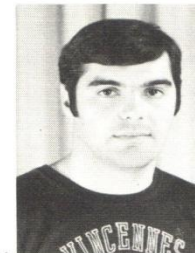

Forward-6'3" -- Freshman-Indianapolis, Indiana

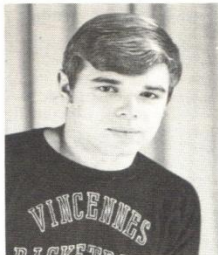

Forward-6'6" - - Freshman-Klondike, Indiana

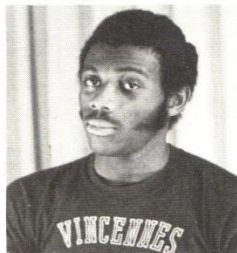

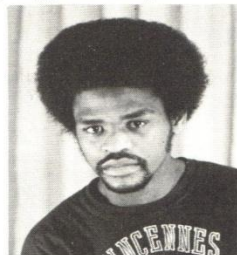

Guard-6'3" - - Senior-Jersey City, New Jersey

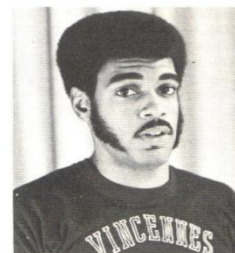

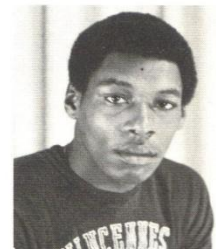


he has been playing, he may be the key to a strong defense of the National Championship trophy. He is a Physical Education major at V.U.

Guard-6'0" - - Freshman-Long Island, New York

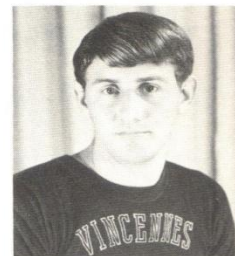

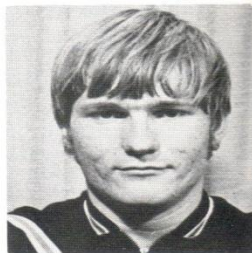

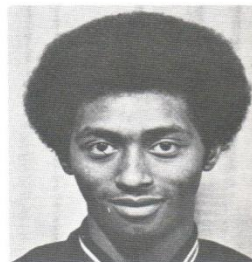
JERRY BOHMAN

Guard - 6'3" - Senior - Bessemer City, North Carolina

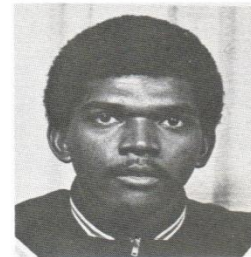

Forward - 6'2" - Senior - Key West, Florida

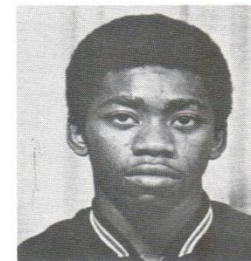

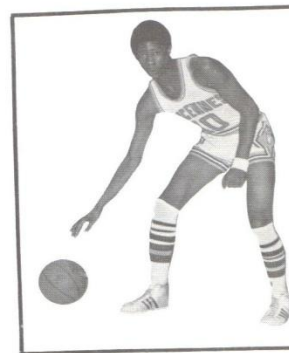
LAWRENCE BOSTON

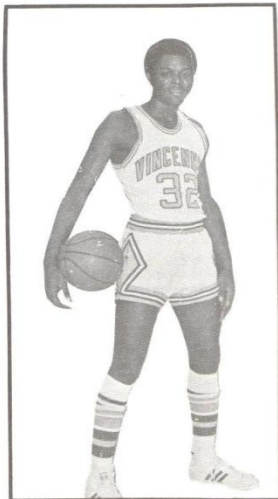

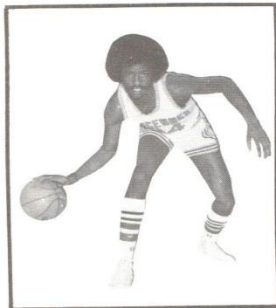
TOM HARRIS
